Thank you for your support in helping us to continue to form disciples, good citizens, and leaders in our church and state.



I want to give a big thanks to our dedicated faculty and staff, whose commitment and optimism this year were truly remarkable. I am also grateful to our parents for their dedication, cooperation and flexibility, and to all the members of St. Ann's Parish who prayed for us, supported us, and gave us the confidence and courage to prevail. Finally, thanks to Father Mink and Father Jasper for their unfailing support and guidance and to the parish staff for their extraordinary efforts.

St. Ann's students enjoyed a wonderful school year filled with as many "normal" experiences as we could safely allow. They experienced hands-on learning, participated in the intellectual life of the classroom, continued their faith formation, and benefited from numerous opportunities for social interaction.

Our protocols kept students and faculty safe; our teachers taught in person and simultaneously online for students who were quarantined at home.

Our students thrived; they worked hard and had fun learning. Our standardized test scores were outstanding, our math league team made the "elite eight" in the state, our Science Olympiad teams were laden with medals, and our middle school students won statewide and national scholastic writing awards.

AN EXTRAORDINARY YEAR

CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS TO THE CAMPUS

- A replacement roof was installed for the Social Hall
- The stage floor was refurbished and the stage was made accessible by wheelchair
- A new sound system was installed in the Social Hall
- The church parking lot was fenced off to enable the space to be used for outdoor gym classes and recess
- New windows were installed in the Taggart wing

SCHOOL COVID RESPONSE IN COMPLIANCE WITH GOVERNMENT GUIDELINES

- Water bottle filling stations installed in both buildings
- Hand sanitizing stations installed at the school entrances
- Stand-alone infrared thermometer stations placed at entrances
- Magnus mobile health app utilized for daily health reporting
- Internet/WiFi was expanded
- Plexiglass shields were installed in key areas
- Two large outdoor tents were purchased and set up in the Celebration Garden
- State-of-the-art room air purifiers were installed in classrooms, social hall and gymnasium
- Bioprotect antimicrobial technology used on high touch surfaces
- Additional cleaning services and staff employed
- The school nurse's office was relocated to a larger location to include COVID isolation rooms



STANDARDIZED TEST SCORES 2021

Elementary schools in the Catholic Diocese of Wilmington administer Renaissance Star, a national standardized assessment tool used in public, private, and parochial schools across the nation.

This standardized assessment indicates that students at St. Ann School performed above the national mean score (50th percentile) and also out performed the diocese in math, reading and early literacy on the Fall 2021 administration.



PROGRAMS AND SERVICE PROJECTS

Programs offered through the year included Reading Assist, Advanced Math, Math League, Science Olympiad, Spelling Bee and Aftercare.





Second Grade supported the Down Syndrome Association of Delaware with their Rock Your Socks campaign.

The 8th Grade Chairs for Charity project raised over \$2,000 for the Make-a-Wish Foundation.



OUR GRADUATES

Scholarships from Catholic High Schools totaling over \$400K were awarded to two-thirds of the students.

Students graduated to high schools including Archmere Academy, St Mark's High School, Padua Academy, Ursuline Academy, Salesianum School and Wilmington Charter School.

NATIONAL JUNIOR HONOR SOCIETY

The National Junior Honor Society (NJHS) is the largest and best-known recognition program for middle and high school students.

The St. Ann Chapter of the National Junior Honor Society is open to those students who meet the required standards in five areas of evaluation: scholarship, service, leadership, character, and citizenship.

Students are selected for membership by a majority vote of the principal-appointed faculty council, which bestows this honor upon qualified students each spring. Students in grades six, seven, and eight are eligible for membership.
