From the desk of Fr. Mink..... “WELL, WHAT ARE YOU WAITING FOR?”

We have all heard this question before. Maybe someone has asked it of us, or we have asked it of someone else. It can be seen as an expression of impatience or perhaps, a thoughtful and prudent pause. Whatever, the case, waiting is not always easy, and as Americans we are not accustomed to waiting too long, at least without an explanation! The season of Advent is upon us and the church calls us to a posture of “patient waiting.” One may wonder if this season would be better suited for summertime when the busyness of life tends to slow down. The Church does have wisdom in calling us to this prayer and patient waiting at a time when we really need it to help prepare our hearts for Christ’s Coming.

Advent is not a season to pretend, since Christ was already born into the world. In the words of St. Cyril of Jerusalem, *“We do not preach only one coming of Christ, but a second one as well, much more glorious than the first. The first coming was marked by patience; the second will bring the crown of a divine kingdom. At his first coming he was wrapped in swaddling clothes in a manger. At his second coming he will be clothed in light as in a garment. In the first coming he endured the cross, in the second coming he will be in glory escorted by an army of Angels.”*

Advent is a time to prepare for that final coming of Christ, by recalling his first coming and the joy it brings as well as remembering that Christ comes into our hearts each day when we receive Him in the Eucharist. Let us wait patiently for the Master’s return this Advent by recalling God’s promises to his people in salvation history, keeping his commandments, and waiting for Him until he returns again in glory!
